Plan to Succeed


- Foster good study habits, environments and skills

Year 9 Studies


Subjects are divided into two groups:

All lead into the senior years of schooling with different options and pathways




PYRAMID OF SPECIALISATION





Core subjects:

- Religious Education
- English

- Science
- Humanities & Social Sciences (HASS)
- Health & Physical Education (Sport) not assessed





2024 elective subjects – choose three

When choosing electives, consider:

- your abilities and talents
- your interests
- the skills sets you could acquire and develop

All subjects will provide knowledge and skills that will benefit you in a future career



When choosing electives, also consider:

- Subject progressions into Senior
 - e.g., Commerce in Year 9/10 leads into the Senior subjects of Economics, Business, Accounting, Legal Studies and Certificate III in Business
 - Refer to Studies Guide for further details
- Subject changes occur at the end of each semester





Looking ahead to Year 9 and 10

- Year 10 subjects are closely aligned to Senior School timetable
- Year 10 has a career education subject in the timetable called Senior Pathways Studies.
- White Card training workshops offered in school (students must be 14)
- Work experience available to Year 9 students in Semester 2 – they must be 14 years of age.



LOOKING AHEAD

Implications for Years 10, 11 and 12

- Most options are still open to students when they select subjects for Years 11 and 12
- Exceptions:
 - Prior knowledge (e.g., Japanese, Music)
 - Worthwhile (e.g., Visual Art, Commerce for Accounting, Economics and Business)



Prerequisites for Senior:


- For senior subject selection, students need to have demonstrated some degree of ability in Years 9 & 10 courses
- Generally, a C standard (except for some Mathematics and Science courses which require a higher result);
- Also, a safety / behaviour requirement for workshop subjects
- Students must achieve the stated prerequisite at the end of Semester 1 in Year 10 to be accepted into a Year 11 & 12 subject



We are preparing students for Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE)

Awarded at the completion of the senior phase of learning:

- has to have been successful met a set standard
- there must be a sufficient amount of learning.







How to enter subject preferences:

- Preferences must be entered by the end of Week 4 (Friday 4 August)





















Steps from here:
